

# Show Me Mass Care Evacuation TTX

“*Show Me Mass Care Evacuation*” is a tabletop exercise that will facilitate the discussion of establishing and maintaining an Emergency Respite Site (ERS) and an Evacuee Reception Center (ERC) in response to a simulated mass evacuation due to a New Madrid Seismic Zone (NMSZ) scenario. “*Show Me Mass Care Evacuation*” begins with an initial scenario description and proceeds with questions pertaining to activation of, staffing and logistical setting up an ERS, Multi-Agency Coordination Center (MACC), and ERC. Each situational update will include discussion questions to allow participants to focus on problem solving as a response team in a low-stress, consequence-free environment. “*Show Me Mass Care Evacuation*” brings together community leaders, emergency managers, first responders, law enforcement, non-profit and community based organizations and local businesses to evaluate the region’s ability to respond to a NMSZ scenario using proposed plans, capabilities and resources.

## **Exercise Objectives:**

- Assess the ability to effectively establish and maintain a unified and coordinated operational structure that integrates critical community partners in planning and implementation of an emergency respite site, multi-agency coordination center, and evacuee reception center.
- Demonstrate the ability to notify and communicate with the appropriate agencies, organizations and personnel to effectively respond to and manage the incidents.
- Assess the ability to effectively provide evacuees with the required necessities (water, snacks, fuel, a place to rest, first aid, etc.) to allow them to continue to move to the evacuation reception center (ERC).
- Identify and utilize various communication modes for physical and virtual MACC participants
